



Ontario Innovation Trip - Collision

Aiming to build opportunity networks for Peruvian and Canadian businesses, the PCCC participated in the 2023 Ontario Innovation Road Trip. The Government of Ontario and municipal partners organized the trip as part of the Collision Conference.
